What is AlMday?

AIMday stands for Academic Industry Meeting day

- A multidisciplinary exchange of knowledge and ideas around a single theme
- Initiated and developed by Uppsala University, Sweden, in 2008
- Adopted by internationally renowned institutions:
 - University of Oxford
 - University of Cambridge
 - Plus universities in Brazil, South Africa, Europe and Canada
- Aims to find answers to questions posed directly by organizations
- Brings understanding and new perspectives to real-world problems

How does AIMday work?



Organizations register and submit their question(s)

We work 1:1 with organizations to develop a research question to address their most pressing issues.



Academic researchers register

We work with the academic community to find specialists to address the question.



Meeting day

We schedule a tailored, structured one-hour workshop discussion between experts from organizations and researchers from universities.



Follow-up

We provide assistance with forming collaborations to solve the challenges discussed during AIMday.

Why Industry & The Academy Participate

- Structured around R&D questions submitted by organizations
- Little upfront preparation required
- Access to small and large companies with real-world research needs
- Opportunity to form new partnerships
- Connect with other researchers in a specific area of research
- Application of cutting-edge research to solve the latest challenges
- Access to research funding opportunities available to academic researchers
- Approximately 40% of questions lead to research collaborations
- Identify opportunities for talent and students

Meeting day

Attend a tailored workshop based on your research:

- Virtual or in-person (COVID permitting)
- Organization's question defines the meeting agenda
- Candid discussion
- One question, one hour, experts only

Each workshop features:

- 1 or 2 organization representatives those who submitted the question(s)
- Researchers (max. 9) who signed up for that question
- Facilitator
- Observers (at the discretion of the organization)
- No consultants

Explore potential pathways to a solution:

- Participants work together to solve organization's pain points
- Organizations and researchers get to know each other
- High likelihood of a constructive, fruitful discussion that could lead to longer-term collaboration

Plus:

- Researchers are allowed to attend more than one workshop (each addressing one question), if schedule allows
- Networking opportunities with other AIMday attendees throughout the day
